

Madam Medic

Madam Medic T-1646 was born in 1973 bred to be a champion. Both her sire and dam were AQHA superior event horses, carrying the bloodlines of Otoe, Depth Charge, Poco Bueno and Pretty Buck. “Madam” was bred, raised, trained and shown by Emmy Highley. As a three year old she earned her ROM in arena performance and an IBHA Championship. At the time this pair was showing, the world show did not exist and the “world champion” title was given to the horse accumulating the most points that year. In 1976 “Madam” finished the year as the Reserve World Champion Halter Horse. In 1977 she was shown all over the Midwest and gained enough points to be the World Champion All Around Horse and Reserve World Champion Halter Horse. With limited showing in 1978 she was able to get enough points to earn a Superior Event in Halter. Having earned all the halter and performance points needed, in 1979 Emmy set her sights on acquiring the dun factor points needed to obtain the coveted Supreme Champion Title. Along the way “Madam” once again earned the title of World Champion All Around Horse. On August 4, 1979 Madam Medic earned the final dun factor point to become IBHA’s first Supreme Champion! Since then only 51 other horses have earned this prestigious title. Madam went on to become an excellent broodmare and earn a total of 137 halter, 35 dun factor, 42 english pleasure and 67 western pleasure points.
